

APPLICATION JOURNEY FOR STUDENTS



NOMINATION

The home university should share a list of student applicant details (names, email addresses) with AUT's Study Abroad Manager.

APPLICATION

Student applications can be submitted through our partner portal, or students can apply on their own. Please discuss preferences with AUT's Study Abroad Manager.

The following supporting documents will be required:

- a. Evidence of citizenship current passport details or birth certificate (and an official English translation if applicable)
- b. Current official academic transcripts with an explanation of the grading system (both sides of the transcript and an official English translation if applicable)
- c. Official academic transcripts of completed undergraduate studies (for postgraduate study only)
- d. English language tests (IELTS/TOEFL or equivalent) as applicable
- e. 1x passport-sized photo of good quality (must be .jpg/.jpeg format)
- f. Formalised work record from past or current employer (for MBA exchanges only)
- g. Other relevant supporting documentation as requested by the AUT Admissions team

English language requirements (if English is not the student's first language):

- IELTS (academic) score of 6.0 overall with all bands 5.5 or higher for undergraduate
- IELTS (academic) score of 6.5 overall with all bands 6.0 or higher for postgraduate

Some specialised study programmes may have a higher English language requirement.

ACADEMICS

Study load

One semester: 60 AUT points/30 ECTS/

15 US Credits

Full-year: 120 AUT points/60 ECTS/30 US Credits

Study Abroad students can find out more about course levels and study options **here**. Undergraduate students will only be considered for postgraduate-level courses with a letter of support from their home university.

For course descriptors and timetables, search for a specific course to see when (semester/times/streams) it is being offered. If no timetable is showing, the course has not yet been confirmed or is not available.

Students can select courses from most subjects at AUT. Subjects that are not available for Study Abroad students are clinical health science, nursing, fashion deign and visual arts (fine arts).

Course availability

Students will be sent instructions after receiving their offer about nominating their choices.

If a student wants to apply for AUT's **Work**Integrated Learning (academic internship) course,
they should begin this process with our Study Abroad
Manager as soon as possible

There is a course change period during the first two weeks of each semester. After this, students will not be permitted to change their study plan.

TRANSCRIPTS

After finishing their semester and the faculty confirms grades, students will receive an email from My eQuals containing a link to register their My eQuals account. They will then be able to access their semester transcript.

The email will be sent to the email address they provided in their student Arion account.

My eQuals is a secure online academic document verification platform, and students can use their My eQuals account to share their academic results online.

They can choose who to share their documents with, and for how long.

ACCOMMODATION AT AUT

If students choose not to stay in AUT's on-campus accommodation, AUT will provide a list of contacts and resources to help them arrange alternative accommodation near campus.

INSURANCE

Due to strict regulations set by the New Zealand Government, medical and travel insurance must be purchased from the **AUT approved providers** list (further details on this will be provided after we have accepted the student's application). Our preferred provider is **Studentsafe Inbound**, and students will be invoiced for this unless they provide an accepted alternative.

NEW ZEALAND STUDENT VISA

Students need to apply for their New Zealand 'Fee Paying Student Visa' online through Immigration New Zealand.
